



Present at the event in Toulouse was Her Excellency Datin Paduka Malai Hajah Halimah binti Malai Haji Yussof, Brunei's Ambassador to France; Mr Karam Chand, RB CEO; Mr Eric Schulz, Airbus Chief Commercial Officer; Awang Mohammad Nazri Mohammad Yusof, Acting Director of Brunei Department of Civil Aviation; Mr Jason Tonich, Vice President and General Manager of GE Aviation Sales; and Mrs Elsie Yamanouye, Director, Customer Program Management of Thales. The aircraft arrived at Brunei International Airport on 25 May, 2018 and was given a traditional water cannon salute and welcome.

RB was honoured to have several high profile visitors view its first A320neo aircraft. THE MAJESTIC CORONATION

OF HIS MAJESTY SULTAN HAJI HASSANAL BOLKIAH MU'IZZADDIN WADDAULAH, SULTAN AND YANG DI-PERTUAN OF BRUNEI DARUSSALAM

A historical event steeped in ancient traditions and royal pageantry of the Malay Islamic Monarchy.

A young military officer and Crown Prince, Pengiran Muda Hassanal Bolkiah, at the age of 21 was installed and titled as His Majesty Sultan Haji Hassanal Bolkiah Mu'izzaddin Waddaulah, the 29th Sultan and Yang Di-Pertuan of Brunei Darussalam in a brief ceremony on 5 October, 1957.

Despite His Majesty's hectic royal engagements soon after, plans were immediately underway for the Coronation. It was announced that the ceremony would take place on 6 Jamadilawal, 1388 in the Muslim calendar corresponding to 1 August, 1968. The news brought much joy to the nation, creating an occasion for all to unite and celebrate. It also did not escape the *rakyat* that the new monarch took on the namesake 'Bolkiah', after Brunei Darussalam's fifth sultan, Sultan Bolkiah (1485-1524), who ruled over a period which was considered to be Brunei Darussalam's Golden Age. This happy coincidence brought much hope and confidence to the nation that their young ruler would steer them towards greatness and prosperity.

Almost 10 months after His Majesty's installation, the Coronation ceremony witnessed combined ancient customs and traditions of Brunei's 600-year-old Malay monarchy. Even by today's royal standards, the splendour, pomp and pageantry of His Majesty's Coronation in 1968 remained one of the most magnificent royal ceremonies ever to be witnessed in the region.

Beginning with the announcement of the Coronation ceremony keeping with ancient traditions, a Yellow Flag was hoisted at the location of Bukit Panggal while a Red Flag was raised in Sungai Kebun across the Brunei River. The bold coloured flags were to announce to the rakyat and Brunei residents (yellow) and foreigners (red) that a royal ceremony was about to take place.

Forty days before the Coronation ceremony of the new Sultan and Yang Di-Pertuan of Brunei Darussalam, the sounding of the Gendang Jaga-Jaga (royal orchestra) was initiated, while royal decorations were set in place at the Lapau, at Istana Darul Hana and along the royal procession route in Brunei Town (today known as Bandar Seri Begawan). These included the tunggol kawan, payong ubor-ubor, ambal and dadap in a variety of colours to symbolise the hierarchy of Brunei's aristocrats. The Balai Pemajangan (Ceremonial Hall) at Istana Nurul Hana was also decked with traditional decorations such as sumbu layang, payung haram, payung tiga ringkat, sapu-sapu ayeng, panji-panji and ula-ula besar.

On the day of the Coronation, the public gathered along the main road of Brunei Town from as early as 6am for the best vantage point to view the royal procession. Meanwhile, His Majesty underwent the *Istiadat Bersiram* (ceremonial

bath) at Istana Darul Hana, while state dignitaries and foreign guests began filing in and taking their seats at the throne room of the Lapau. A 21-gun salute was then sounded to mark the end of the ceremonial bath.

From Istana Darul Hana, His Majesty was driven to the Edinburgh Bridge where he was joined by his late father, titled as the Begawan Sultan, and the State's highest royal officials – the Pengiran Bendahara, Pengiran Di-Gadong, Pengiran Pemancha, and Pengiran Temenggong. Adhering to ancient traditions, only the men proceeded to the Lapau while the women, including Her Majesty Raja Isteri Pengiran Anak Hajah Saleha, remained at the *Pasiban Agong Singgahsana* (royal throne) of Istana Darul Hana

At the Edinburgh Bridge, His Majesty took his seat on the Usongan Diraja, an ornately carved golden royal chariot, accompanied by the State's highest royal court officials carrying the Royal Regalia and designated courtiers carrying the rest of the regalia. The Mahkota (coronation crown) was borne by Pengiran Paduka Tuan Sahibul Karib, the Keris Si Naga (royal keris) was borne by Pengiran Maharaja Adinda Sahibul Fikri, the Perhiasan Tunggal (Sultan's regalia) was borne by Pehin Jawatan Dalam, the Kuching Emas (golden cat) was borne by Pehin Orang Kaya Penggawa Laila Bentara Diraja and the Kimhap or Tongkat Ajai (golden chin rest in the shape of an up-stretched arm) was borne by Setiausaha Sulit Laila Rahsia Kebawah Duli Yang Maha Mulia. The royal procession then made its way through Brunei Town to the Lapau.

His Majesty was resplendent on the royal chariot, dressed in a custom-made royal attire of *kain tenunan* (woven cloth) in red brocade with the *Arab Gegati Berpakan* design. Completing the royal attire was an *amban* (sash) of the same design in fuchsia, a regal *tara* (aigrette) on his *dastar* (headgear), a gem-studded *kuas* (shoulder ornament), and a *keris* on his left side. The ceremonial procession was accompanied by members of the royal court bearing the full royal regalia of Brunei Darussalam, respectively.

Upon arriving at the Lapau, His Majesty stepped down from the royal chariot and accepted the salute from the Royal Brunei Armed Forces before proceeding to the Council Chamber. His Majesty took his seat on the gold-covered *Patarana* (throne

chamber). Among the guests on the day were representatives of the Sultans of Kelantan, Johor, Selangor, Pahang and Negeri Sembilan from Malaysia as well as the British Resident to Brunei, His Excellency A. R. Adair, representing Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II of the United Kingdom.


The Coronation ceremony began with the Pengiran Penggawa Laila Betara Adat Istiadat Diraja requesting the consent of the late Al-Marhum Paduka Seri Begawan Sultan Haji Omar 'Ali Saifuddien Sa'adul Khairi Waddien to crown and place the *Keris Si Naga* on His Majesty. This was a symbolic gesture of the official handing over and appointment of His Majesty Sultan Haji Hassanal Bolkiah Mu'izzaddin Waddaulah as the 29th Ruler and Sultan and Yang Di-Pertuan of Brunei Darussalam. As soon as His Majesty was crowned, the late Al-Marhum Paduka Seri Begawan Sultan slowly drew his *keris* from its scabbard and pointed it to the audience as a signal for everyone present to pay homage to the new Sultan.

At the same time the Wazir, Cheteria and Yang Berhormat Pehin Orang Kaya Di-Gadong also drew their keris, after which the Seri Paduka Pengiran Bendahara cried out "Puja" (Salute) seven times, each accompanied by a titir (beating) of the Nobat Diraja (royal orchestra) and a gun salute. This was followed by the cry from Pehin Orang Kaya Di-Gadong to "Sembah Setia" (oath of loyalty), which he made seven times; with each call enthusiastically resonated outside the Lapau.

This was then followed by a proclamation by the Pengiran Bendahara:

"It is by God's Will that Your Highness is now King in this State of Brunei; It is by God's Will that Your Highness now is highest in the State of Brunei; It is by God's Will that Your Highness now is leader of the people in the State of Brunei; It is by God's Will that Your Highness now is protector of the people in the State of Brunei; It is by God's Will that Your Highness now is the pillar supporting this State of Brunei; It is by God's Will that Your Highness now is Yang Di-Pertuan of this State of Brunei; May Your Highness forever occupy the royal throne of Brunei, governing and leading the people of the State of Brunei Darussalam, Amin Ya-Rabbal Alamin."

In symbolising the oath of loyalty from the *rakyat* to their Sultan and Yang Di-Pertuan, a young royal court official unsheathed his *keris* and, holding the sharp point to his chest, positioned the hilt in the direction of the Sultan. While the royal orchestra played the traditional royal coronation ceremonial music, a 21-gun salute was released greeting the newly crowned Sultan.


At the conclusion of the Coronation ceremony, His Majesty stepped down from the throne chamber and walked with his attendants to the end of the Lapau. The royal entourage retraced the processional route, passing through the main street (later named Jalan Sultan to mark the historic Coronation event) before returning to Istana Darul Hana to attend the crowning of Her Majesty Raja Isteri Pengiran Anak Hajah Saleha.

Following traditions, the palace grounds were open to the *rakyat* to pay homage to their new Ruler. An estimated 50,000 people lined the streets in the morning and continued to grow until evening as the *rakyat* took the opportunity to share in the celebrations of this auspicious and historical Coronation event.

KEGEMILANGAN ISTIADAT PERPUSPAAN

KEBAWAH DULI YANG MAHA MULIA SULTAN HAJI HASSANAL BOLKIAH MU'IZZADDIN WADDAULAH, SULTAN DAN YANG DI-PERTUAN NEGARA BRUNEI DARUSSALAM

Peristiwa bersejarah penuh kegemilangan adat istiadat serta tradisi temurun Melayu Islam Beraja.

Seorang pegawai tentera serta Pengiran Muda Mahkota, Pengiran Muda Hassanal Bolkiah, yang berusia 21 tahun telah ditabalkan sebagai pemerintah dan bergelaran Kebawah Duli Yang Maha Mulia Paduka Seri Baginda Sultan Haji Hassanal Bolkiah Mu'izzaddin Waddaulah, Sultan dan Yang Di-Pertuan Negara Brunei Darussalam Ke-29 dalam istiadat ringkas pada 5 Oktober, 1957.

Sungguhpun Baginda amat sibuk dengan urusan diraja, rancangan istiadat perpuspaan tetap dirancangkan. Istiadat tersebut telah diumumkan akan berlangsung pada 6 Jamadilawal, 1388 Hijrah bersamaan 1 Ogos, 1968. Pengumuman ini amat menggembirakan kerana mewujudkan satu peluang bagi rakyat jelata bersatu serta meraikannya. Mereka juga sedar bahawa Sultan Bolkiah (1485-1524), pemerintah Negara Brunei Darussalam Ke-5 yang senama dengan Baginda telah memerintah pada masa yang dikenali sebagai Zaman Kegemilangan. Persamaan nama yang dipilih oleh Baginda Sultan ini membawa harapan besar kepada rakyat jelata yang amat yakin pemerintah muda mereka akan memimpin negara ke arah kejayaan dan keunggulan.

Hampir 10 bulan selepas pertabalan Kebawah Duli Yang Maha Mulia, Istiadat Perpuspaan menyaksikan adat istiadat serta tradisi temurun kesultanan Melayu Brunei yang berusia 600 tahun. Dibandingkan taraf diraja hari ini, kegemilang Istiadat Perpuspaan pada tahun 1968 itu tetap menjadi salah satu upacara istiadat diraja yang paling mengagumkan yang pernah disaksikan di rantau ini.

Bermula dengan pengisytiharan rasmi serta tradisi temurun Istiadat Perpuspaan, Bendera Kuning dinaikkan di Bukit Panggal sementara Bendera Merah dipacakkan di Sungai Kebun di seberang Sungai Brunei. Bendera tersebut memberi makluman kepada rakyat dan penduduk Brunei (kuning) serta warga asing (merah) bahawa suatu isitadat diraja akan dilangsungkan.

Empat puluh hari sebelum Istiadat Perpuspaan Sultan dan Yang Di-Pertuan Negara Brunei Darussalam yang baru dilangsungkan, Gendang Jaga-Jaga mula dipa<mark>lu, sement</mark>ara perhiasan diraja disiapkan deng<mark>an sempu</mark>rna di Lapau, dan juga di Istana Darul Hana serta di sepanjang jalan Bandar Brunei (kini dikenali Bandar Seri Begawan) yang akan dilalui perarakan diraja. 





























The world's largest Victorian glasshouse once again is home – as it had been since its birth in 1863 – to some of the world's rarest and most threatened plants. After five years, the doors of the spectacular Temperate House threw open once more, revealing 10,000 breathtaking plants that have been uprooted and replanted, making this magnificent structure the true jewel in Kew's crown – an architectural wonder, horticulturists' haven, the most captivating of classrooms.

Entering the glasshouse, visitors will embark on a round-the-world adventure. They might find themselves in Mauritius, where they will see *Dombeya mauritiana*, a tree that was thought to be extinct in the wild until Kew's renowned 'plant messiah' Carlos Magdalena found one growing in the Mauritian highlands. After many trials and tribulations (including forming a human ladder to reach the lowest branch!), Carlos was able to gather and return with cuttings, and Kew is now the only place in the world with this tree in cultivation. Around the corner, transported to the mountains of Nepal, visitors will encounter the *Taxus wallichiana*, exploited for the Taxol market (a chemotherapy drug) and now subject to a clonal propagation programme to help conserve it in the wild.

Originally designed by world-famous architect Decimus Burton, heritage architects Donald Insall have updated and modernised key features to enable the building to function as a contemporary working space. Over 69,000 individual elements were removed from the building and cleaned, repaired or replaced. This included the replacement of a staggering 15,000 panes of glass, 69,000 sections of metal and enough scaffolding to cover the length of the M25. Whilst retaining its Victorian splendour, the renovated Temperate House embodies cutting edge engineering techniques, and is expected to be a vital, forward facing beacon of contemporary plant education.

A programme of interactive events and artistic entertainment, running throughout the summer and designed for the whole family, will really bring the stories of these plants to life. The opening of the first ever Kew Community Allotments has been created to engage with a wide range of groups including those with additional needs. Kew is also working with local children's centres to invite young parents and children to take part in the first ever Kew Babies programme, where they learn through craft and music activities.

Given the unique nature of restoring a building of this calibre, Kew introduced an apprenticeship programme, part-funded by the Heritage Lottery Fund, with the aim of providing young people from local areas of high deprivation with the skills, training and confidence to succeed in specialist horticultural careers. Ten young people consequently spent a year carefully removing plants from the building, and since then have been tending to them in their temporary homes and shadowing





Finally, visitors can also fall in love with Gnomus. This larger-than-life puppet will greet families and visitors on a story-led walking tour, highlighting the most interesting tales around the vital importance of plants. Gnomus will be around to greet guests from 21 July to 2 September, 2018.







Do not believe that Singapore is made only for those with a penchant for shopping. Look beyond the malls and you will find a city that is constantly reinventing itself to be the art hub of the world. From visual arts to dance and theatre, there are art events and festivals happening in Singapore throughout the year, and always something for every kind of art enthusiast out there. The arts scene in Singapore is constantly evolving and changing, giving visitors something new to look forward to each time they visit a museum. performing arts hub or art enclave.

There are always a colourful variety of art events that take place. If you're looking for a visual feast unlike any other, Singapore as a city will not disappoint.

First off, Singapore Art Week. This celebration of the visual arts is an annual affair that typically occurs in January and features countless special exhibitions and highlights. There is something artsy (walking tours, film screenings, gallery openings and plenty more) to do in almost every neighbourhood in the city, from Chinatown to Marina Bay and of course, art hotspots like Gillman Barracks and the Bras Basah.Bugis precinct.



One of the biggest and must-attend segments is Art Stage Singapore. Known as the flagship art fair of Southeast Asia, Art Stage Singapore features handpicked galleries from across the region as well as a slew of bold contemporary art. It's a big gathering of the 'who's who' in the contemporary art scene in Asia, so if you live and breathe art just like the rest of these key players, here is where you want to be and rub shoulders with international and local artists, collectors and curators.

Of course, we must never overlook one of the biggest, most major contemporary art events in Singapore - the Singapore Biennale. Taking place once every two years and organised by the Singapore Art Museum, the venue itself is a mustvisit for any art lover in town. Each year, a different theme is chosen and the works and displays featured would follow it closely. For example, in 2013, the Biennale was titled "If the World Changed" and covered thought-provoking topics like disasters (Japanese couple Ken and Julia Yonetani built mesmerising glowing chandeliers made from uranium glass and UV lighting in reaction to the Fukushima disaster in 2011), and transgender issues (Shieko Reto's exhibition was both serious and light-hearted – complete with monochrome displays and intriguing sketches). Check out the Singapore Biennale website for more information on these fascinating array of programmes and highlights.








If you love revelling in the nightlife, the Singapore Night Festival will enthral. An extravaganza that takes place this August from 17 to 25, the Singapore Night Festival is a feast for the senses. Expect aerial performances, interactive light shows and installations that transform the Singapore Art Museum and National Museum of Singapore into interactive architectural canvases.


Best of all, many of the segments across the two weekends are free, so head to the heart of the Bras Basah. Bugis precinct and watch the place transform before your very eyes.

Meanwhile, key elements like theatre, music and dance take centre stage at the prominent Singapore International Festival of Arts (SIFA). Expect a line-up of programmes and productions that will satisfy the art and film enthusiast in you. Each year, festival director Ong Keng Sen brings something different to the table. Previous SIFAs have featured "Kumar's Living Together" (2015) – a stand-up comedy performed by five well-loved homegrown comedians, focusing on the Lion City's multi-racial and multi-national housing landscape – and Ron Arad's monumental outdoor video installation, '720°' (2016).

Nha Trang serves up some of the best beaches in Vietnam, and it is no wonder that this seaside town – just slightly over an hour by flight from Ho Chi Minh City – has been hugely popular of late. The weather is deliciously warm all year round, and in the summer, the cellophane-clear waters are so calm that they almost resemble a huge lake.

The reimagining of this Vietnamese Riviera has seen a number of new accommodations cropping up. But on the Cam Ranh peninsula, The Anam is proving to be the most exciting brand to plan for all kinds of holidays – whether it's restorative, where the focus is on you, to family trips and romantic getaways for couples.

The independently-own resort was built with a grand master plan in mind. Ambitious with its accommodation option – 96 rooms in an elevated five-floor hotel wing and 117 villas spread across the property, the resort sits on a sprawling 12-hectare ground with manicured turf grass and some 3,000 palm trees, three swimming pools, a beach club, a 3D mini theatre, a spa, a French restaurant alongside three other F&B outlets – one of which fronts a 300-metre private beach. While the grounds seem vast, it's a pleasant stroll from villa to the resort's facilities, but guests always have the option to ring for a buggy ride.

If you forget the size, The Anam is truly an architectural fascination. Designed in Vietnamese age-old aesthetics







a bit dressier. The lightly grilled scallops were perfectly executed, so was the beetroot cooked sous vide paired with goat cheese as a salad in a light dressing. The menu is kept simple with refined techniques and gorgeous plating that lets diners see the work that goes behind it. The Saigon Bar next door makes for a perfect ending to your night. With its stylish interiors hung with black-and-white photographs from local Vietnamese artist, Mai Loc, the space is classy with a low-key vibe that makes downing a fruit smoothie or coffee seem hip. The Indochine is more relaxed, where buffet breakfast is spread out with live kitchens and an a la carte dinner menu that includes pizzas and pastas.

There is plenty to do to while the time away, too. If you can tear yourself from the spa, the resort offers complimentary non-motorised watersports activities. Mornings can be spent stretching the limbs with resident yoga instructor, Umesh. There is also a tennis court located behind the hotel wing for those wanting to work a sweat. Amid the grassy expanse of lawn, kids can fly kites and play ball or Frisbee. Most guests with young ones in tow are just happy to have them run around freely to enjoy the breeze and sunshine. Twice a week, half a dozen of the staff's mothers take part in the resort's unique initiative, serving up authentic home-cooked meals to guests in what is known as "Mama's Cooking". Apart from

The 34th Brunei National Day celebrated on 24 February, 2018 was a showcase of a massive parade and performances with approximately 30,000 participants. "Achieving the National Vision" was the theme emphasising that every sector involved in the development of the country has the responsibility in striving to realising the thirteen strategies of Brunei Vision 2035.

The Golden Jubilee celebrations procession on 5 October, 2017 witnessed a crowd of more than 60,000 lining the main streets in the heart of Bandar Seri Begawan. The rakyat and public were in joyous spirits to catch a glimpse of His Majesty and pay homage to his contributions to the country's development, stability and peace.

Two decades ago, His Majesty Sultan Haji Hassanal Bolkiah Mu'izzaddin Waddaulah ibni Al-Marhum Sultan Haji Omar 'Ali Saifuddien Sa'adul Khairi Waddien, Sultan and Yang Di-Pertuan of Brunei Darussalam, put in place the first roadmap to making Brunei Darussalam a more competitive nation at home and abroad. Dedicated to see his nation and people progress, His Majesty pioneered a long-term plan for Brunei Darussalam, assisted by a planning council tasked to develop a national framework that strategically spells out the technical and financial aspects for a future vision of the nation. Named the Council for Long-Term Development Planning, the council's first report in 2007 made several recommendations that paved the way for the establishment of the Supreme Council of Brunei Vision 2035 (Majlis Tertinggi Wawasan Brunei 2035) in 2014 to realise the nation's potential.

Brunei Vision 2035 is His Majesty's visionary approach for placing Brunei Darussalam on the best track for its future. While the nation has certainly made rapid progress since gaining its independence

in 1984, His Majesty wishes to steer the nation away from the over-dependence on oil and gas and to equip its *rakyat* to be better prepared to address the uncertainty and challenges faced in the global economy, oil price fluctuations and the economic recessions that have hit much of Europe.

The Brunei Vision 2035 has several key components outlined that would see Brunei Darussalam widely recognised for the accomplishments of its well educated and highly-skilled *rakyat* measured by the highest international standard, quality of life that is amongst the top 10 nations in the world, and a dynamic and sustainable economy with income per capita within the top ten countries in the world. His Majesty further established thirteen (13) strategies to achieve the abovementioned goals and these are as follows:

 an education strategy to prepare our people for employment and achievement in a world that is increasingly competitive and knowledge-based,

- an economic strategy to create new employment for our people and expand business opportunities within Brunei Darussalam through the promotion of investment, foreign and domestic, both in downstream industries as well as in economic clusters beyond the oil and gas industry,
- a security strategy to safeguard our political stability and our sovereignty as a nation and that links our defence and diplomatic capabilities and our capacity to respond to threats from disease and natural catastrophe.
- an institutional development strategy to enhance good governance in both the public and private sectors, high quality public services, modern and pragmatic legal and regulatory frameworks and efficient government procedures that entail a minimum of bureaucratic "red tape",
- a local business development strategy to enhance opportunities for local small and medium-sized enterprises (SMEs) as well as enable Brunei Malays to achieve leadership in business and industry by developing greater competitive strength.
- an infrastructure development strategy to ensure continued investment by government and through public-private sector partnership in developing and maintaining world-class infrastructure with special emphasis placed on education, health and industry,

- a social security strategy to ensure that, as the nation prospers, all citizens are properly cared for,
- an environmental strategy to ensure the proper conservation of our natural environment and cultural habitat. It will provide health and safety in line with the highest international practices.
- a health strategy to improve the health and wellbeing of the people of Brunei Darussalam through a highquality and comprehensive health care system which is effective, efficient, responsive, affordable, equitable and accessible to all in the country.
- a religious strategy to ensure the preservation of the nation's identity guided by the Malay Islamic Monarchy concept, practicing the noble values of Islam based on faith and piety towards a balanced development of the country,
- a land use strategy to ensure optimal use of land in line with the aspiration to have a viable land and assets management that contributes towards economic growth,
- a communications and ICT infrastructure strategy to ensure connectivity that facilitates the movement of people, goods and services towards creating economic space, increasing economic resilience and promoting competitiveness for economic development.
- a manpower planning strategy to ensure sufficient supply of manpower equipped with the appropriate skills to match the demand needed for economic development.

03 His Majesty officially declared the opening of the 14th session of Legislative Council of Brunei Darussalam on 5 March, 2018. Since 1959 the Council has played a significant role in the development of Brunei The Council not only evaluates, considers and approves budgets and revenue estimates, but it also advises His Maiestv on the drive of the Government reviews policies implemented by the Government and passes bills and motions brought by the Government and other members of the Council





A total of 261 graduates of the Seri Begawan Religious Teachers University College (KUPUSB) received their degrees and diplomas at the 7th Convocation Ceremony held at the International Convention Centre in Berakas on 25 October, 2017. His Majesty, who is also the Chancellor of KUPUSB conferred the degrees and diplomas to the graduates during the ceremony

Addressing this vision on the eve of Brunei Darussalam's 33rd National Day, His Majesty in his *titah* announced that champions for every strategy have been appointed to oversee Brunei Vision 2035's three goals. His Majesty also has consented to the formation of a working framework which, among others, outlines the core areas that should be given attention to achieve the vision goals.

Furthermore His Majesty reminded the rakyat to implement these strategies with full commitment and determination. In urging them to be united in achieving the Brunei Vision 2035, His Majesty continued: "We should ensure that all efforts are based on consensus, relevant and meet the current needs. This is key to the success of the nation's Vision 2035. This covers all, whether they are in the government or in the private sector, and it is crucial to instill the spirit of cooperation and understanding among them. All of us are required to work as a team without engaging in matters that are against the law."

The monarch then added: "Although we have the infrastructure, technology, equipment, mechanism and a good system, if our intention is not good, the outcome will also be not good. For instance, if there is corruption in the government, it will drag the nation towards a bad state, even though the workforce is highly skillful or comprised of scholars. We should control this to prevent the nation from experiencing undesirable developments."

As His Majesty pointed out, Brunei Vision 2035 will require the close cooperation between the government, the private sector, and the *rakyat*. To reiterate His Majesty's *titah* marking the New Year of 2018: "For it is only with this cooperation can we generate a business and commercial climate that is much simpler and thus, at the same time, make the country that more inviting in the eyes of foreign investors. If this atmosphere can be maintained, then that is the advantage for Brunei, wherever it is necessary for Brunei."

Dua dekad yang lalu, Kebawah Duli Yang Maha Mulia Paduka Seri Baginda Sultan Haji Hassanal Bolkiah Mu'izzaddin Waddaulah ibni Al-Marhum Sultan Haii Omar 'Ali Saifuddien Sa'adul Khairi Waddien, Sultan dan Yang Di-Pertuan Negara Brunei Darussalam, memulakan pelan rancangan yang pertama untuk membentuk Negara Brunei Darussalam sebagai suatu negara yang lebih berdaya saing di dalam dan di luar negara. Berdedikasi untuk menjamin kemajuan bangsa dan negara, Baginda merintis sebuah pelan jangka panjang, dibantu oleh sebuah majlis perancangan yang telah ditugaskan untuk mengembangkan rangka kerja kebangsaan yang akan merangkumi aspek teknikal dan kewangan secara strategik, untuk wawasan masa depan negara. Dinamakan Majlis Perancangan Pembangunan Jangka Panjang, laporan pertama majlis tersebut pada tahun 2007 mengandungi beberapa cadangan yang telah membuka jalan kepada penubuhan Majlis Tertinggi Wawasan Brunei 2035 untuk merealisasikan potensi besar Negara Brunei Darussalam.

Wawasan Brunei 2035 merupakan aspirasi KDYMM untuk menempatkan Negara Brunei Darussalam pada landasan yang terbaik untuk masa depannya. Walaupun Negara Brunei Darussalam telah mencapai kemajuan yang pesat sejak mencapai kemerdekaan pada tahun 1984, Baginda berhasrat untuk mengemudi negara dari ketergantungan terhadap minyak dan gas serta melengkapkan rakyat agar lebih bersedia untuk menghadapi ketidakpastian dan cabaran yang berterusan dalam ekonomi global, turun naik harga minyak dan susulan kemelesetan ekonomi Eropah.

Wawasan Brunei 2035 mengandungi beberapa komponen utama yang akan melihat Negara Brunei Darussalam diiktiraf secara meluas untuk pencapaian rakyat yang berpendidikan serta berkemahiran tinggi seperti yang diukur oleh piawaian antarabangsa yang tertinggi, kualiti hidup yang akan meletakkan Negara Brunei Darussalam pada tempat 10 dan ke atas di dunia, serta ekonomi yang dinamik dan berdaya tahan dengan pendapatan per kapita di kedudukan 10 teratas di dunia. Untuk mencapai matlamat tersebut, Baginda telah menetapkan tiga belas (13) strategi seperti yang berikut:

- strategi pendidikan untuk mempersiapkan rakyat kita bagi pekerjaan dan pencapaian dalam dunia yang semakin kompetitif dan berteraskan ilmu pengetahuan,
- strategi ekonomi untuk mewujudkan pekerjaan baru bagi rakyat dan memperluaskan peluang perusahaan dan perniagaan di Negara Brunei

Darussalam melalui galakan pelaburan, asing dan domestik, dalam industri hiliran dan economic clusters di luar industri minyak dan gas,

- strategi keselamatan untuk memelihara kestabilan politik dan mempertahankan kedaulatan negara serta menghubungkan keupayaan pertahanan dengan keupayaan diplomatik dan juga persediaan negara dalam menangani ancaman penyakit dan bencana alam,
- strategi pembangunan institusi untuk meningkatkan kualiti pentadbiran dan kepimpinan di sektor awam dan swasta, perkhidmatan awam yang berkualiti tinggi, rangka perundangan dan peraturan yang moden dan pragmatik, dan prosedur kerajaan yang efisien dengan birokrasi yang minima,
- strategi pembangunan perniagaan tempatan untuk mempertingkatkan peluang bagi perusahaan kecil dan sederhana (PKS) tempatan serta juga memudahkan rakyat Melayu Brunei untuk menjadi pemimpin dalam perniagaan dan industri menerusi kekuatan daya saing,
- strategi pembangunan infrastruktur untuk memastikan pelaburan berterusan oleh kerajaan dan menerusi perkongsian sektor awam-swasta (Public-Private Partnership), dalam pembangunan infrastruktur bertaraf dunia dengan memberikan keutamaan kepada bidang pendidikan, kesihatan dan industri.

- strategi kesihatan untuk meningkatkan kesihatan dan kesejahteraan rakyat dan penduduk Brunei Darussalam melalui sistem penjagaan kesihatan berkualiti tinggi dan komprehensif, efektif, efisien, responsif, mampu dibiayai, saksama dan mudah diperolehi oleh semua di negara ini,
- strategi keagamaan untuk memastikan pemeliharaan identiti negara berpandukan konsep Melayu Islam Beraja, mengawalkan nilai-nilai murni Islam berdasarkan iman dan taqwa ke arah pembangunan yang seimbang di negara ini,
- strategi penggunaan tanah untuk memastikan penggunaan tanah yang optima serta selaras dengan aspirasi bagi pengurusan aset dan sumber tanah yang berdayamaju dan menyumbang secara mapan kepada pertumbuhan ekonomi negara,
- strategi infrastruktur komunikasi dan ICT untuk memastikan perhubungan yang memudahkan pergerakan orang ramai, barangan dan perkhidmatan untuk memacu pertumbuhan

 strategi perancangan tenaga manusia untuk menyediakan bekalan tenaga kerja yang dilengkapi dengan kemahiran yang bersesuaian selari dengan permintaan yang diperlukan untuk pembangunan ekonomi.

Wawasan ini telah diulaskan pada malam Hari Kebangsaan ke-33 Negara Brunei Darussalam, di mana Baginda bertitah bahawa peneraju yang bertanggungjawab kepada setiap strategi telah dilantik untuk menyelia tiga sasaran utama Wawasan Brunei 2035. Baginda juga telah berkenan untuk pembentukan rangka kerja yang, di antara lain, menggariskan lingkungan utama yang perlu diberikan perhatian wajar untuk mencapai matlamat wawasan.

Lebih lanjut Baginda mengingatkan rakyat supaya melaksanakan strategi ini dengan penuh komitmen dan keazaman. Dalam menggalakkan rakyat supaya bersatu untuk mencapai matlamat Wawasan 2035, Baginda melanjutkan: "Kita harus memastikan bahawa kesemua usaha adalah berdasarkan konsensus, relevan dan memenuhi keperluan semasa. Ini merupakan kunci kepada kejayaan Wawasan 2035. Ia merangkumi kesemua lapisan masyarakat, sama ada mereka berada di sektor

kerajaan atau di sektor swasta, dan ia penting untuk memupuk semangat kerjasama dan pemahaman di kalangan mereka. Kita semua perlu bekerja sebagai sebuah pasukan tanpa terlibat dalam perkara yang bertentangan dengan undang-undang."

Baginda juga menambah bahawa: "Walaupun kita mempunyai infrastruktur, teknologi, peralatan, mekanisme dan sistem yang baik, jika niat kita tidak baik, hasilnya juga tidak akan menjadi baik. Misalnya, jika terdapat kegiatan rasuah dalam kerajaan, ia akan menyeret negara turun ke arah keadaan buruk, walaupun tenaga kerja berkemahiran tinggi atau terdiri daripada para cendekiawan. Kita harus mengawal perkara ini untuk mengelakkan negara daripada mengalami perkembangan yang tidak diingini."

Sebagaimana yang ditegaskan oleh Baginda, Wawasan Brunei 2035 memerlukan kerjasama erat antara kerajaan, sektor swasta dan rakyat. Untuk mengulangi titah KDYMM yang menanda Tahun Baru 2018: "Kerana hanya dengan kerjasama ini, boleh kita menghasilkan iklim perniagaan dan komersil yang lebih kukuh dan, pada masa yang sama, menjadikan Negara Brunei Darussalam lebih menarik di mata pelabur asing. Sekiranya suasana ini dapat dikekalkan, maka ia merupakan kelebihan untuk Negara Brunei Darussalam, tidak dikira jika ia diperlukan untuk Negara Brunei Darussalam."



SEE

Hand Luggage

For your safety and comfort, you may store your hand luggage in the overhead lockers or under the seat in front of you. Please do not hesitate to ask our cabin crew for help in stowing your luggage properly. Be careful when opening the overhead luggage compartments, as items dislodged by aircraft movement may fall on you or fellow guests.

Liquids, Aerosols and Gels (LAG)

Various countries have implemented restrictions on the carriage of liquids,

aerosols and gels in compliance with new guidelines set by the International Civil Aviation Organization (ICAO). Guests transiting through airports and carrying any liquids, pastes and gels in containers over 100ml may be asked to dispose of the items at security checkpoints.

These restrictions may affect your ability to carry duty-free purchases onboard the aircraft. Customers are advised to check with duty free personnel before making their purchases. All liquids, aerosols and gels must be carried in containers of no greater than 100ml/3.3oz capacity (approximately 100gm in weight) and placed in a transparent, resealable plastic bag. The plastic bag must be removed from carry on baggage and presented to security personnel at the checkpoint for inspection and separate x-ray screening.

Exceptions to the new regulations are medicines and dietary supplements

needed during a flight, including baby food. Proof of need may be required.

Use of Electronic Equipment

Electronic devices such as Citizen's band (CB) radio, remote-controlled devices (such as radio controlled toys), and transmitting devices that emit radio frequencies are not to be used at any time during the flight. These devices may interfere with the aircraft's electronic equipment, compromising aircraft safety and endangering the lives of guests and crew.

The following devices may be used on board, except during take-off, initial climb, approach and landing, mobile phones (which must be switched to flight mode), personal computers, FM receivers, calculators, electronic shavers, audio and video recorders, hand-held computer games, and playback devices.



1990s

- > RB took delivery of the first of three leased Boeing 767-200ER aircraft in June 1990 and set a long distance world record for twin-engine commercial airlines.

- > The opportunity to expand regional connections saw RB establishing a service to Surabaya in 1997.

2000s

- > RB took delivery of two new Airbus A319 aircraft in August and September 2003.
- > Two more Airbus A320s were delivered in December 2003 and January 2004.
- In January 2010, RB introduced Royal Brunei Holidays, a revamp of its Golden Touch Holidays, which offers passengers value-for-money holiday packages available locally and abroad.
- > Direct services to Shanghai were re-launched in March 2010.
- > RB's newly-leased Boeing 777-200ER aircraft took off on its first commercial flight from Bandar Seri Begawan to London via Dubai in June 2010.
- > RB commenced four-times weekly flights to Melbourne in March 2011.



> In October 2012, RB launched a rebranding

journey with a new logo and livery.

- > RB launched "A betterfly", the Boeing 787 Dreamliner and commenced its first commercial flight from Bandar Seri Begawan to Singapore on 18 October, 2013, followed by flights to Dubai and London on 1 December, 2013 and to Melbourne op 2 April 2014
- > RB unveiled its new heritage-inspired uniforms on 21 February, 2014.
- > The first of RB's two A320 CEO aircraft arrived in Bandar Seri Begawan on 26 September, 2015.





Lithium Batteries

The abundant stored energy that makes lithium batteries practical also makes them dangerous when they are not packed and carried properly. Royal Brunei takes the initiatives to increase the safety onboard with the carriage limitations (from industry initiatives, ICAO and IATA Dangerous Goods Regulations guidance) to mitigate against the risks of the hazards.

Low and medium powered rechargeable batteries in equipment and limited quantity of spares are recommended as carry on baggage.

All spare units must be in the original packaging or packed to insulate the terminals. Medium and large non-rechargeable must be carried as cargo/freight in accordance with current Dangerous Goods Regulations.

High-Powered batteries are not permitted onboard passenger aircraft.

Non-smoking Policy

Royal Brunei Airlines operates non-smoking flights to all destinations.

Reconfirmation

Reconfirmation is not required except for guests travelling to and from the Middle East. Please reconfirm your departure flight at least 72 hours in advance with the local Royal Brunei Airlines office or your travel agent. Failure to do so could result in the cancellation of your reservations.

Fly through the airport. You can now book online at www.flyroyalbrunei.com, check in

online and print your own electronic ticket (e-ticket). Online check in is available 24 hours before flight departure and closes 60 minutes before departure time.

Check In

Check in counters at the Brunei International Airport are open three hours before flight departure. Guests are advised to check in at least two hours before departure to allow for security and baggage checks. Check in counters will be closed 45 minutes before departure, after which no boarding passes will be issued. Royal Brunei Airlines also advises its guests to reach the boarding gate 20 minutes before the flight departs to avoid missing their flights.

BRUNEI INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT

Brunei International Airport's computerised passenger and cargo handling facilities can handle 3 million guests and 50,000 tonnes of cargo a year. Among the facilities offered at the airport are the Airport Prayer Hall (Surau Lapangan Terbang Antarabangsa Brunei Darussalam), telephones and Free Wi-Fi services, restaurants and shower facilities for guests who want to rest or freshen up before their flight.

For guests's comfort and convenience, RB Service Centre is located on the Departure Hall area. Guests can make reservations, ticket purchase, book tour packages and redeem Royal Skies miles. The Customer Service Centre at the Brunei International Airport operates 7 days a week, from 8am to 9pm Mondays to Saturdays, and 8am to 5pm on Sundays; except for Friday midday break from 12noon to 2pm.

Our Business Class and Royal Skies Elite guests can now enjoy the service of our RB porters at departure curb-side for baggage assistance and trolley service to the check-in counters. The premium check-in lounge offers our Business Class and Royal Skies Elite guests with a relaxed check-in experience.

RB Economy class guests and groups booking may proceed to RB check-in counter Row B.

Business Class guests and Royal Skies Gold members are invited to access the RB Business Class Lounge prior to their flights. Fitted with plush, comfortable interiors and furnishings designed to make guests feel at home, the lounge offers ample opportunity to relax and experience RB's warm hospitality. Guests at the Business Class Lounge have access to executive meeting rooms and all the facilities offered at the Sky Lounge in addition to the coffee bar.

STAYING FIT

drop ear to shoulder and

Trunk flex With both feet on the floor and stomach held in, slowly bend forward and walk your hands down the front of your legs toward your ankles. Hold stretch for 15 seconds and slowly sit back up.

TRAVELLER'S GUIDE Brunei Visitor Information

Visas* Austrian, German, Malaysian, Singaporean, British nationals with the right of abode in the United Kingdom. The Netherlands and New Zealand nationals are exempted from the requirement to obtain a visa for visits not exceeding 30 days. American passport holders can enter Brunei Darussalam for three months without visas. For nationals of Belgium, Canada, Denmark, France. Indonesia, Italy, Japan, Luxembourg, Republic of Maldives, Norway, Oman, The Philippines, South Korea, Spain, Sweden, Switzerland, Thailand and The Principality of Liechtenstein - visas are waived for 14-day visits. Nationals of Australia are issued visas on arrival at the Brunei International Airport for visits not exceeding 30 days.

All other visitors entering Brunei Darussalam must have visas obtainable from any Brunei Darussalam diplomatic mission abroad. These visas are normally issued for a two-week stay but can be renewed in Brunei. Visitors must hold onward tickets and sufficient funds to support themselves while in the country.

Duty-free Allowance* The import of the following products is subject to restrictions imposed by Brunei's Customs and Excise Department.

Cigarettes: Effective 1 April, 2017, guests will be charged duty on cigarettes at the following rates:

Alcohol: Non-Muslim guests may bring in two bottles of liquor plus 12 cans of beer for personal consumption only; and a reasonable quantity of perfumes.

Transportation Brunei International Airport is about 11km from the capital, Car rental, public buses and registered taxis are available at the arrivals. The Land transport department strongly advise visitors to only use regulated and insured taxis. For more info on registered taxis you may visit – www.mincom.gov.bn/brunitaxifare or contact +6737181643.

Currency The Brunei dollar is on a par with the Singapore dollar, which is also accepted in Brunei. Banks, hotels and many department stores will cash traveller's cheques.

Language Malay is the official language but English is widely used. Other languages include Chinese and its dialect variants and other indigenous dialects. Although the official religion is Islam, other faiths including Christianity and Buddhism are practised.

Clothing Light clothing is advisable as the climate is generally warm and humid. Women are requested to dress modestly in keeping with local customs.

Health Doctors provide private medical services for a nominal charge. There are a number of state health clinics and hospitals.

Credit Cards Hotels, department stores and other major establishments generally accept all internationally known credit

Tipping Optional. Some hotels add a 10 per cent service charge to their room rates

Telephones Overseas calls can be made from hotel rooms through the operator, or via international direct dialling (IDD). There are also coin and phonecard operated public telephones.

Utilities Power supply is 220 - 240v, 50 cycles. The PAL and NTSC systems are used by local television. Tap water is generally safe to drink although some take the precaution of boiling it.

Media Radio Television Brunei has nightly news bulletins and a range of popular entertainment in both English and Malay. Cable network and Malaysian television programmes can also be received. There are two local daily newspapers namely: Borneo Bulletin (English) and Media Permata (Malay). Other regional and international publications are also available at newstands.

Food For the adventurous, the food stalls offer Malay favourites, such as satay (barbecued meat on a skewer) and local dishes prepared with curry or coconut milk. Chinese. European and

Indian cuisines are also available. All F&B businesses, including hotel restaurants, close for Friday prayer 12pm to 2pm. For hotel guests, room service dining operates as usual.

Hotels Accommodation in the capital ranges from international standard to middle range hotels. Service apartments are also available at reasonable rates.

Shopping Department stores and shops offer goods ranging from cosmetics and stereos to local handicrafts such as the keris (an ornamental dagger), miniature brass cannons, and kain tenunan, a cloth woven with gold or silver threads.

Festivals and Celebrations National Day, 23 February, Hari Raya, the end of the Muslim fasting month, and His Majesty The Sultan's birthday, 15 July. Other public holidays include Chinese Lunar New Year and Christmas.

Customs and Courtesy

- In mosques, visitors should remove their shoes and should not pass in front of people at prayer. A woman should ensure that her head, knees and arms are covered before entering mosques. Robes are provided at the entrance to the mosque.
- A Bruneian shakes hands lightly and brings his hands to his chest. Members of the opposite sex do not shake hands.
- It is impolite to point with the index finger (use the right thumb instead) or to beckon someone with fingers and palm facing upwards. Instead the whole hand should be waved with palm facing downwards. The right fist should never be smacked into the left palm.
- Gifts, particularly food, are passed with the right hand.

The nation became independent in 1984 and, thanks to its large reserves of oil and gas, now has one of the highest standards of living in the world. Its population of just over 408,000 is made up of two-thirds ethnic Malay, with the remainder being Chinese, Indian and other indigenous groups. The Sultanate has four districts: Brunei-Muara (which includes the capital Bandar Seri Begawan), Temburong, Tutong and Belait. 'Darussalam', the Arabic word for 'Abode of Peace' describes Brunei's Islamic history that dates back some 1,500 years. Today, Brunei remains the world's only Malay Islamic Monarchy with an unbroken royal lineage that has ruled the nation for the past 600 years.


