






Markets

Who doesn't love market shopping? They're cheap, they're fun and they are never boring. And where markets are concerned, Bangkok knows how to do them right. The city is filled with markets of all kinds that cover all hours. From places to shop for antiques, furniture, flowers and food, there are markets that start as early as three in the morning to those that stay on till just past midnight. Jam packed with both locals and tourists, the markets are perhaps the best – and fun – way to really get a glimpse of the local culture. While they are many new markets that have sprung up in recent years, the mother of all markets remain Chatuchak, the weekend-only market that coined the term "shopcation" for visitors who come to Bangkok only to shop here.

Chatuchak is still considered the biggest and baddest of all the markets in Bangkok simply because you really can find everything here. From wash basins to hunting knives and risqué innerwear, the 8,000 market stalls will not disappoint you. No doubt the 35-acre market – an organised chaos at best – may overwhelm the first-timer, yet it remains incredibly popular with tourists and locals alike because it simply is a local institution. Don't forget to grab some local grub and never leave without trying a coconut shake.

Muay Thai

Also known as the "art of eight limbs", the Thai martial art of "muay" is a popular sport in the country. The origins date back several hundred years, and the eight limbs referred to are the use of both fists, elbows, shins and knees in the body combat. More than just a traditional sport, Muay Thai also trains the athlete to gain overall fitness and emotional wellbeing.

Many professional Muay Thai fighters begin training when young. Even so, you can still channel your inner warrior at various gyms and fitness camps that offer beginner classes in Muay Thai. At Master Toddy's Muay Thai Academy, where programmes are certified by Thailand's Ministry of Education, students are walked through the practical aspects of the sport before being taken to the ring to discover the techniques that include pad work, bag work and sparring. Master Toddy himself is somewhat of a celebrity, having trained over 40 world champions. For an alternative experience, The Siam, an urban luxury hotel in the Old Bangkok quarters, seem to be a fitting start to your journey of discovering this ancient art. The Siam offers private lessons in their state-of-the-art Muay Thai gym. After a bout in the ring, you can ease your sore muscles at their spa and then dine on a chef-exclusive fighter's diet menu to ensure a wholesome journey into your Muay Thai experience.

Marriott Marquis Queen's Park

For a look into the hotel of the future, step into Bangkok Marriott Marquis Queen's Park and be prepared to be wowed. The largest of Marriott's property in Asia Pacific, it has a whopping 1,360 rooms, but you will never feel overwhelmed by it. Service remains intimate and attentive, and there are many smart elements in the hotel that make this marquis property stand out. Check-in is done at sleek reception consoles, rooms and public spaces are filled with murals and intricate designs that pay homage to the Siamese culture, private dining spaces are aplenty where theatrics take centrestage – such as an in-house soba chef and a Chinese tea master.

The lobby is full of luxe details, yet always with a Thai design aspect that makes it both charming and elegant. Rooms are equipped with free wifi, a flexible work surface, and floor-to-ceiling windows for views of the city. Its location, a walking distance to two of the best malls in Bangkok – EmQuartier and Emporium – is also a plus. Queen's Park, just behind the hotel, makes it easy to go for a jog in the mornings and catch some local action.

Has anyone ever been to Bangkok and not get a rub down? Whether it's a stimulating foot reflexology, a traditional Thai or a whole body treatment with a herbal hot compress, any kind of a massage will leave you feeling calm and relaxed and ready to face another day in the city. Walk down any soi (lane) and there will be no shortage of a reputable and clean massage place to check out.

The popular chainhouse, Let's Relax, with outlets across the city is known for its traditional massage and reliable service. Let's Relax also offers facials that are affordably priced. Another favourite, Healthland, with many branches within easy reach of the Skytrain and subway, includes a therapeutic massage treatment that concentrates on specific troubled areas performed by a qualified therapist. Its herbal compress massage uses a poultice made from tamarind leaves, bergamot peels, camphor and black herbal seeds that really relaxes sore muscles. Meanwhile, although RarinJinda Wellness Spa has only two branches in the city, it is worth to seek them out to try their signature Elements of Life treatment where a massage is performed on a warm sand bed and includes a Tibetan sound therapy that is totally out of this world!





Central Embassy

There are malls in every corner and neighbourhood of the city because everyone escapes into these air-conditioned comfort zones from the heat. Sometimes, it's not about what you can buy at these malls, but what you can experience. Central Embassy is considered Bangkok's newest icon, with its seamless glass and mixed use of rare materials in its architecture. The minimalistic interiors and futuristic design is a breath of fresh air, giving shoppers a sense of space and freedom to move about. Over 200 international reknowned brands are housed here, including the Gucci and Moschino flagship stores. But there are also high street brands such as Onitsuka Tiger and Lacoste for those less inclined to shop luxury. Central Embassy is also home to Siwilai, a modern day market place that stocks on multi brands. Look out for exclusive product collaborations between Siwilai and brands like Kitsune and Orlebar Brown. Fashion aside, the store also offers books, magazines and other curios. Check out its own namesake cafe next door that makes some of the best egg dishes for brunch.

Round up your day at Central Embassy with a movie at one of the most expensive cinemas to be designed in the world. A THB120 million-screen built to create a high-end, cinema-going experience comes with intimate screening rooms and cocooned seating, blankets and pillows, and a butler-service call button. Now *that's* movie with a difference.

AQUE SYNTHESIS

Making claim to a slice of Straits heaven at The Majestic Malacca.

When it opened in 2008, The Majestic Malacca aimed high: not only to restore the once revered landmark of the city, The Majestic Hotel, but also revive the city's unique heritage and legacy. A decade on, and we are glad to see the promise remains unchanged.

The Majestic Malacca's main attraction remains its unmatched scale in which it passionately embraces Malacca's rich cultural history for the present to appreciate. Founded in 1929 and built as a private home, the building turned into a hotel only in 1955 before taking the present name. Though it resembled little of the luxurious boutique hotel that it is today, the property back then still enjoyed the perks of a prime location being near the Melaka River.







Throughout guests' stay, patches of the hotel's past can be spotted, amplifying the important part of its identity: from the decorative Straits Chinese porcelain tiles in the lobby to the Straits Settlement windows in the restaurant. The greeting upon arrival at the lobby, housed in the original mansion, by staff in unique *kebaya*, feels more like a homecoming of sorts. But beyond the re-polished tiles and dressed-up attendants, this hotel is anything but symbolic.

The newly minted Melba at the Mansion, the hotel's main restaurant, offers a window into one of the city's most signature-heavy yet elusive cuisines: Kristang. This lesserknown gourmet tradition is a hybrid flavour of Malacca and Portuguese, commonly known as Eurasian, and is rich with spices and herbs that made Malacca phenomenally rich during the spice trade of the 15th century. Chef Melba Nunis delves into her family roots and comfort foods from her award-winning cookbook, A Kristang Family Cookbook, to bring guests on a journey of unique Kristang flavours. Her black sotong (squid) sambal is an artful study in slow cooking and delicate flavours, making use of the intact ink sacs to create a velvety black sauce with a distinctive umami taste. Another, kari debal, or popularly known as devil curry, is a great example of Kristang's amalgamation of cultures, bringing together the culinary styles of the Dutch, Portuguese, Malay, Indian and Chinese. While there are many versions to this dish, at Melba's, there was just the right amount of vinegar to cut through the otherwise overly fiery sambal while the chunks of chicken meat and slivers of onion and ginger lend both a rustic and wholesome feel to the dish

If sampling the food is not enough, then try your hand at its preparation. The Kristang Culinary Journey lets you spend half a day with Chef Melba and join her as she navigates her way through the local market. There are frequent stops in between shopping – as expected – as everyone calls









out to their favourite chef. Likewise, Chef Melba would stop briefly to chat with her favourite fishmonger (who tells her the crabs today are fresh) or the gentleman who prepares her supply of fresh coconut milk. The excursion goes beyond discovering the various herbs and spices common to the Kristang kitchen and instead provides the rare opportunity to experience the friendliness of the locals and their cordial relationship with her. Once the shopping is done, guests return to the hotel for a private cooking class.

The Majestic Malacca is also perhaps the only hotel in the world that celebrates the unique healing and beauty traditions of the Straits Peranakan community. The Peranakan culture, sometimes referred to as Baba Nyonya, is a unique synthesis of Chinese and Malay influences. Those familiar with the Spa Village brand will no doubt understand the work that goes into curating the menu of each Spa Village. Unsurprisingly, the team did not disappoint here. The hard-boiled egg treatment was a throwback to my childhood, where every bruise and bump would feel better with an egg roll. As weird as this sounds, the egg rolling body therapy – where a hard-boiled egg is literally rolled over the body – has a soothing and calming effect. Plus, the massage afterwards seems to be a fitting end to the delicious ennui that came later. Many of the treatments here strive to replicate the multi-faceted 12-day wedding ceremony typical of the Peranakan culture. It's an elaborate fanfare of sorts - with hair masks luxuriously made from calamansi or coconut and pandan, facials of birdnest with tapioca or starfruit, and bodywraps made from aloe or cucumber. Short of the real thing, the treatments still manage to whisk you partially away into this colourful community that sadly, remains very few today.







The property further invites guests to immerse themselves in the city's enduring past. The complimentary Historical Walk allows you to see firsthand remnants of the city's rich history: the paradox and contradiction between the (surprisingly) haphazard development and the hidden beauty of the old buildings and structures. Walk past old godowns and former homes of rich merchants that all open to the river and its once busy traffic, see old forts formerly alive with military secrets, and traverse evocative neighbourhoods with their anomalous trading activities. Streets are hauntingly quiet in the evenings, but this is when you can - if only just briefly - breathe in the beauty that must have been.



From 3 March to 15 July, 2018 MARGIELA/GALLIERA,1989-2009, the first retrospective exhibition in Paris devoted to Belgian fashion designer Martin Margiela, will see it tracing the career from spring-summer 1989 to spring-summer 2009 of a designer who not only questioned the structure of garments, but also challenged the structure of the fashion system.

Martin Margiela graduated from the fashion department of the Royal Academy of Fine Arts, Antwerp, in 1980. After a stint as Jean Paul Gaultier's assistant between 1984 and 1987, he was associated with the Antwerp school and became the only Belgian designer of his generation to found his own fashion house in Paris.

Margiela's conceptual approach challenged the fashion aesthetics of his time. His way of constructing a garment involved deconstructing it, exposing the inside, the lining, and the unfinished parts, and revealing the different stages of manufacture: pleats, shoulder pads, patterns, bastings and all. He pushed the scale of a garment to extremes, enlarging the proportions to 200% in his "Oversize Collection", for example, or by adapting dolls' clothes to the life-size human form in the "Barbie Collection". He printed trompe-l'oeil photos of dresses, sweaters and coats and established a new form of "cloven" shoe inspired by traditional Japanese tabi (with the big toe separated from the others).

Margiela questioned the obsolescence of clothes with his «Artisanal» collection, created from vintage garments and recovered materials transformed into unique hand-sewn pieces. And also with his "Replica" series of vintage clothes garnered from around the world and reproduced identically.

Margiela remains the creator without a face, the man who does not do interviews, and whose clothes came with a plain white label bereft of any brand-name. This man who promotes anonymity is famous, not only for his use of white, a colour that he espoused in a multitude of shades, but also for holding his défilés in unusual venues: in carparks, warehouses, a metro station, or on waste ground.

Using more than 130 silhouettes, videos of défilés, House archives and special installations, the *Margiela / Galliera* exhibition offers us an unprecedented look at one of the most influential contemporary fashion designers.

The scenography for this retrospective was worked out in collaboration with Margiela as an exhibition and, at the same time, a site under construction. Margiela always paid particular attention to the composition of the space of his shows. With this retrospective, Margiela wanted to create the sense of wandering through a private place, establishing a close and direct relationship with the garments.

So visitors will see the "exhibition" as an object deconstructed: it is about progress on the site, the state of transition, uncertainties and possibilities. Traces of the dismantling of the previous exhibition and the assembly activities have been preserved. Not all the surfaces have been covered in white, and lighting plays a critical role to both light and support. It punctuates the exhibition trail, intermittently lighting up the shadow that makes up most of the exhibition.

What's interesting too about the exhibition is that young visitors are also not forgotten. Individual workshops offer the young opportunities to have a hand at being a fashion apprentice, designing recycle jewellery, upcycling and recycling, and stotytelling, to name a few.

Breathtaking scenes across the world as Muslims celebrate the end of Ramadhan.



The Muslim festival of Eid ul Fitr will be celebrated in many parts of the world 14 June or 15 June this year. It marks the beginning of Syawwal and the end of Islam's holy month of Ramadhan, where practising Muslims abstain from consuming food and drinks from sunrise to sunset. The timing of Eid is based on the Islamic lunar calendar and the sighting of the new moon of Syawwal, hence why celebrations vary from country to country and why both Ramadhan and Eid "change" through the Gregorian calendar from year to year.


Eid ul Fitr is one of two Eid festivals observed by the Muslim faithful. The second, Eid ul Adha, comes at the climax of the Hajj, the sacred journey to Makkah.

Worldwide, the Eid ul Fitr celebrations begin with Muslims performing a special Eid prayer in congregation. In major cities, mosques will be overflowing with the crowd, with worshippers sometimes filling the streets. In places where mosques cannot accommodate the congregation, the prayer is often conducted in open spaces, such as a football stadium or an open field.

Traditional greetings during the Islamic holiday begin with Eid Mubarak, which means "Blessed Eid." Another greeting, "taqabbal Allah minna wa minkum (May Allah accept (this worship) from us and from you)" follows the congratulatory greeting Prophet Muhammad's (peace be upon him) companions would say to one another on the occasion of Eid.

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In 1993, His Majesty Sultan Haji Hassanal Bolkiah Mu'izzaddin Waddaulah ibni Al-Marhum Sultan Haji Omar 'Ali Saifuddien Sa'adul Khairi Waddien, Sultan and Yang Di-Pertuan of Brunei Darussalam, consented to inaugurate the Islamic Bank of Brunei (IBB) to transform Brunei into an Islamic finance hub. 





What made you to guit banking and bake fulltime?

I gave birth at 40 years old to my first son in 2011. This changed my outlook in life. I wanted to be able to give more time and afford a better life for my son. So I took a chance on a product I knew Cebu was well known for and added a twist to it. I did not resign immediately. I knew a friend who had a store in the airport and that was where I started to sell my products. Two weeks after I sold my first few boxes, I got calls from (luxury retail store) Rustans, Manila Airport stores and eventually the giant retail company, SM. The response was overwhelming that I had to resign from my bank job. And that was just three months after the launch of Mango Caramel. I was euphoric. My project was a hit!

Did the 22 years in banking help you prepare for life as an entrepreneur?

Well, it taught me perseverance and hard work! Being an employee and an entrepreneur is the same in many aspects of life. You have to work hard in order to succeed. As an employee, you need to please your boss. As an entrepreneur, I need to please my customers!

What were your early challenges running the bakeshop?

I'd have to say staffing and training. It's so hard to get the right dedicated personnel and then train them only to find out later they leave you for a bigger company or opportunities abroad. I'm still a small company and bakers would rather be with the big wigs.

And how does it feel going up against the big wigs?

I'm such a small company compared to the giants. I just feel honoured to be able to be on the same playing field.

Let's talk about your Mango Caramel. What inspired you to come up with the different flavours apart from the usual chocolate?

I love carame!!!! And anything with caramel in it. I wanted to share my love with everyone! I love pistachios because it's so healthy. I love cashews and the Philippines has an abundant supply of this just like mangoes. This was one of the deciding factors—that the supply of ingredients must be available locally in Cebu.

Mango Caramel now sports a different packaging than when it first started. What was the inspiration behind this new artwork and colours?

The design concept was decided by myself together with my niece who is very talented. We both wanted the Maya bird and the mango tree to be part of the background. The Maya bird was the national bird of the Philippines until it was changed in 1995 by President Fidel Ramos to the Philippine eagle. The colours represent the four seasons of our global weather. I wanted to represent the Philippines and send a message that my products are the best gifts for all seasons around the world. Now, that was the inspiration.

Tell us a little bit about your bakery before. What were you selling?

All types of bread. When I started the bakery, we were on an order basis. I had a small sign in front of my house. It was a home based business. The bakeshop was operating from the kitchen of my house. When the orders for Mango Caramel started coming in, I eventually built a two-storey annexe to house Mango Caramel's operations.

I still operate small. I had so many enquiries already for export and distribution abroad. I am currently searching for a bigger property to house the expansion of Mango Caramel's production and banana chips, our newest product just launched this year.



- > The maiden Royal Brunei Airlines flight to Singapore left Bandar Seri Begawan on a Boeing 737-200 on 14 May, 1975.

- Services to Bangkok and Manila were added.

Alcohol-free Environment Policy

Hand Luggage

For your safety and comfort, you may store your hand luggage in the overhead lockers or under the seat in front of you. Please do not hesitate to ask our cabin crew for help in stowing your luggage properly. Be careful when opening the overhead luggage compartments, as items dislodged by aircraft movement may fall on you or fellow passengers.

Liquids, Aerosols and Gels (LAG)

Various countries have implemented restrictions on the carriage of liquids, aerosols and gels in compliance with new guidelines set by the International Civil Aviation Organization (ICAO). Passengers transiting through airports and carrying any liquids, pastes and gels in containers over 100ml may be asked to dispose of the items at security checkpoints.

These restrictions may affect your ability to carry duty-free purchases onboard the aircraft. Customers are advised to check with duty free personnel before making their purchases. All liquids, aerosols and gels must be carried in containers of no greater than 100ml/3.3oz capacity (approximately 100gm in weight) and placed in a transparent, resealable plastic bag. The plastic bag must be removed from carry on baggage and presented to security

personnel at the checkpoint for inspection and separate x-ray screening.

Exceptions to the new regulations are medicines and dietary supplements needed during a flight, including baby food. Proof of need may be required.

Use of Electronic Equipment

Electronic devices such as Citizen's band (CB) radio, remote-controlled devices (such as radio controlled toys), and transmitting devices that emit radio frequencies are not to be used at any time during the flight. These devices may interfere with the aircraft's electronic equipment, compromising aircraft safety and endangering the lives of passengers and crew.

The following devices may be used on board, except during take-off, initial climb, approach and landing; mobile phones (which must be

- > Twice-weekly flights to London Heathrow began in May 1991. The route became a daily service on 1 December, 1996.
- > RB employed the use of a Fokker 50 aircraft to service Miri and Labuan in Malaysia, two destinations that were significant to the growth of Brunei's oil and gas industry.
- > The opportunity to expand regional connections saw RB establishing a service to Surabaya in 1997.

2000s

- > RB took delivery of two new Airbus A319 aircraft in August and September 2003.
- > Two more Airbus A320s were delivered in December 2003 and January 2004.
- In January 2010, RB introduced Royal Brunei Holidays, a revamp of its Golden Touch Holidays, which offers passengers value-for-money holiday packages available locally and abroad.
- > Direct services to Shanghai were re-launched in March 2010.
- > RB's newly-leased Boeing 777-200ER aircraft took off on its first commercial flight from Bandar Seri Begawan to London via Dubai in June 2010.
- > RB commenced four-times weekly flights to Melbourne in March 2011.

2010s

- > In October 2012, RB launched a rebranding journey with a new logo and livery.
- > RB launched "A betterfly", the Boeing 787 Dreamliner and commenced its first commercial flight from Bandar Seri Begawan to Singapore on 18 October, 2013, followed by flights to Dubai and London on 1 December, 2013 and to Melbourne on 2 April, 2014.
- > RB unveiled its new heritage-inspired uniforms on 21 February, 2014.
- > The first of RB's two A320 CEO aircraft arrived in Bandar Seri Begawan on 26 September, 2015.

Lithium Batteries

The abundant stored energy that makes lithium batteries practical also makes them dangerous when they are not packed and carried properly. Royal Brunei takes the initiatives to increase the safety onboard with the carriage limitations (from industry initiatives, ICAO and IATA Dangerous Goods Regulations guidance) to mitigate against the risks of the hazards.

Low and medium powered rechargeable batteries in equipment and limited quantity of spares are recommended as carry on baggage. All spare units must be in the original packaging or packed to insulate the terminals. Medium and large non-rechargeable must be carried as cargo/freight in accordance with current Dangerous

Goods Regulations. High-Powered batteries are not permitted onboard passenger aircraft.

Information of safe carriage of lithium batteries on-board RB flights are also available at the RB websites www.bruneiair.com.

Non-smoking Policy

Royal Brunei Airlines operates non-smoking flights to all destinations.

Reconfirmation

Reconfirmation is not required except for passengers travelling to and from the Middle East. Please reconfirm your departure flight at least 72 hours in advance with the local Royal Brunei Airlines office or your travel agent. Failure to do so could result in the cancellation of your reservations.

Online Booking

Fly through the airport. You can now book online at www.flyroyalbrunei.com, check in online and print your own electronic ticket

(e-ticket). Online check in is available 24 hours before flight departure and closes 60 minutes before departure time.

Check In

Check in counters at the Brunei International Airport are open three hours before flight departure. Passengers are advised to check in at least two hours before departure to allow for security and baggage checks. Check in counters will be closed 45 minutes before departure, after which no boarding passes will be issued. Royal Brunei Airlines also advises its passengers to reach the boarding gate 20 minutes before the flight departs to avoid missing their flights.

BRUNEI INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT

Brunei International Airport's computerised passenger and cargo handling facilities can handle 3 million passengers and 50,000 tonnes of cargo a year. Among the facilities offered at the airport are the Airport Prayer Hall (Surau Lapangan Terbang Antarabangsa Brunei Darussalam), telephones and Free Wi-Fi services, restaurants and shower facilities for passengers who want to rest or freshen up before their flight.

For customer comfort and convenience, RB Service Centre is located on the Departure Hall area. Passengers can make reservations, ticket purchase, book tour packages and redeem Royal Skies miles. The Customer Service Centre at the Brunei International Airport operates 7 days a week, from 8am to

9pm Mondays to Saturdays, and 8am to 5pm on Sundays; except for Friday midday break from 12noon to 2pm.

Our Business Class and Royal Skies Elite passengers can now enjoy the service of our RB porters at departure curb-side for baggage assistance and trolley service to the check-in counters. The premium check-in lounge offers our Business Class and Royal Skies Elite passengers with a relaxed check-in experience.

RB Economy class passengers and groups booking may proceed to RB check-in counter Row B.

Business Class and Royal Skies Elite passengers are able to access the SkyLounge

prior to their flights. Complimentary massage chairs, shower rooms, ablution areas and High Definition TV are available.

Duty-free shops offer consumer goods at competitive prices. There are several outlets, including a money changer located at the departure/transit hall. On sale are portable electrical goods with international warranties, designer goods, perfumes and confectionery. Brunei International Airport is a smoke-free airport.

STAYING FIT

Ankle circles While seated, raise one foot and draw a circle with your toes Rotate clockwise for 15 seconds and repeat the same counterclockwise Reneat with the other foot. You can do one foot at a time or both simultaneously



Knee lifts Lift and hug your knee to your chest as close as you can Hold for 15 seconds. Alternate knee. Repeat 10-15 times for each knee



Shoulder roll Relax shoulders then hunch them forward Rotate gently 10-15 times.



Neck roll With shoulders relaxed, drop ear to shoulder and gently roll neck forward and back, holding each position about five seconds. Repeat five times.



Upper back flex Stretch hands forward, then pull back slowly as far as possible. Repeat 10-15 times.



Trunk flex With both feet on the floor and stomach held in, slowly bend forward and walk your hands down the front of your legs toward your ankles. Hold stretch for 15 seconds and slowly sit back up

TRAVELLER'S GUIDE Brunei Visitor Information

Visas* Austrian, German, Malaysian Singaporean British nationals with the right of abode in the United Kingdom, The Netherlands and New Zealand nationals are exempted from the requirement to obtain a visa for visits not exceeding 30 days. American passport holders can enter Brunei Darussalam for three months without visas. For nationals of Belgium, Canada, Denmark, France, Indonesia, Italy, Japan, Luxembourg, Republic of Maldives, Norway, Oman, The Philippines, South Korea, Spain, Sweden, Switzerland, Thailand and The Principality of Liechtenstein - visas are waived for 14day visits. Nationals of Australia are issued visas on arrival at the Brunei International Airport for visits not exceeding 30 days.

All other visitors entering Brunei Darussalam must have visas obtainable from any Brunei Darussalam diplomatic mission abroad. These visas are normally issued for a two-week stay but can be renewed in Brunei. Visitors must hold onward tickets and sufficient funds to support themselves while in the country

Currency Bearer Negotiation Instrument Declaration Passengers entering or leaving Brunei who carry physical currency or bearer negotiable instruments valued at BND15,000 or more are required to complete a declaration form and submit it to a customs officer (if arriving in Brunei) or an immigration officer (if departing Brunei).

Duty-free Allowance* The import of the following products is subject to restrictions imposed by Brunei's Customs and Excise Department

Cigarettes: Effective 1 April, 2017, passengers will be charged duty on cigarettes at the following rates per stick \$0.50 for each 20 sticks pack \$10 \$100 for each carton of 10 packs

Please refer the new charges imposed by Royal Customs and Excise Department.

Alcohol: Non-Muslim passengers may bring in two bottles of liquor plus 12 cans of beer for personal consumption only; and a reasonable quantity of perfumes

Transportation Brunei International Airport is about 11km from the capital, Car rental, public buses and registered taxis are available at the arrivals. The Land transport department strongly advise visitors to only use regulated and insured taxis. For more info on registered taxis you may visit - www.mincom.gov.bn/ brunitaxifare or contact +6737181643.

Currency The Brunei dollar is on a par with the Singapore dollar, which is also accepted in Brunei, Banks, hotels and many department stores will cash traveller's cheques.

Language Malay is the official language but English is widely used. Other languages include Chinese and its dialect variants and other indigenous dialects. Although the official religion is Islam, other faiths including Christianity and Buddhism are practised.

Clothing Light clothing is advisable as the climate is generally warm and humid. Women are requested to dress modestly in keeping with local customs.

Health Doctors provide private medical services for a nominal charge. There are a number of state health clinics and hospitals.

Credit Cards Hotels, department stores and other major establishments generally accept all internationally known credit cards

Tipping Optional. Some hotels add a 10 per cent service charge to their room rates.

Telephones Overseas calls can be made from hotel rooms through the operator or via international direct dialling (IDD). There are also coin and phonecard operated public telephones

Utilities Power supply is 220 - 240v, 50 cycles. The PAL and NTSC systems are used by local television. Tap water is generally safe to drink although some take the precaution of boiling it

Media Radio Television Brunei has nightly news bulletins and a range of popular entertainment in both English and Malay. Cable network and Malaysian television programmes can also be received. There are two local daily newspapers namely: Borneo Bulletin (English) and Media Permata (Malay). Other regional and international publications are also available at newstands

Food For the adventurous, the food stalls. offer Malay favourites, such as satay (barbecued meat on a skewer) and local dishes prepared with curry or coconut milk. Chinese, European and Indian cuisines are also available. All F&B businesses, including hotel restaurants, close for Friday prayer 12nm to 2pm. For hotel guests, room service dining operates as usual.

Hotels Accommodation in the capital ranges from international standard to middle range hotels. Service apartments are also available at reasonable rates

Shopping Department stores and shops offer goods ranging from cosmetics and stereos to local handicrafts such as the keris (an ornamental dagger), miniature brass cannons and kain tenunan, a cloth woven with gold or silver threads.

Festivals and Celebrations National Day. 23 February, Hari Raya, the end of the Muslim fasting month, and His Majesty The Sultan's birthday, 15 July. Other public holidays include Chinese Lunar New Year and Christmas

Customs and Courtesy

- In mosques visitors should remove their shoes and should not pass in front of people at prayer. A woman should ensure that her head, knees and arms are covered before entering mosques. Robes are provided at the entrance to the mosque
- · A Bruneian shakes hands lightly and brings his hands to his chest. Members of the opposite sex do not shake hands.
- It is impolite to point with the index finger (use the right thumb instead) or to beckon someone with fingers and palm facing upwards. Instead the whole hand should be waved with palm facing downwards. The right fist should never be smacked into the left palm.
- · Gifts, particularly food, are passed with the right hand.



The nation became independent in 1984 and, thanks to its large reserves of oil and gas, now has one of the highest standards of living in the world. Its population of just over 408,000 is made up of two-thirds ethnic Malay, with the remainder being Chinese, Indian and other indigenous groups. The Sultanate has four districts: Brunei-Muara (which includes the capital Bandar Seri Begawan), Temburong, Tutong and Belait. 'Darussalam', the Arabic word for 'Abode of Peace' describes Brunei's Islamic history that dates back some 1,500 years. Today, Brunei remains the world's only Malay Islamic Monarchy with an unbroken royal lineage that has ruled the nation for the past 600 years.

THE OMAR ALI SAIFUDDIEN MOSQUE

Brunei Darussalam's iconic landmark, the mosque was completed in 1958 and is named after the 28th Sultan, the late Sultan Omar Ali Saifuddien, who is referred to as the Architect of Modern Brunei

ISTANA NURUL IMAN

The official residence of His Majesty Sultan Haji Hassanal Bolkiah Mu'izzaddin Waddaulah, Sultan and Yang Di-Pertuan of Brunei Darussalam. Although not open to public, except during Hari Raya Aidil Fitri, its golden domes and vaulted roof can be viewed from Kampong Ayer.

LAPAU AND DEWAN MAJLIS

The Royal Ceremonial Hall features an exquisite golden dome and hosts all of the sultanate's traditional royal ceremonies.

THE ROYAL REGALIA

The museum is home to a collection of royal regalia, including the royal chariot, gold and silver ceremonial armoury, the jewel encrusted crowns used during the coronation and a replica of the throne, which is used by the Sultan on state occasions.

ISTANA DARUSSALAM

Located on Jalan Sumbiling, this wooden palace captures the architectural heritage of old Malay palaces. Visitors may view only from outside.

THE SULTAN HAJI HASSANAL BOLKIAH FOUNDATION COMPLEX

The capital's most popular shopping venues, it combines both traditional Malay and modern architecture.

BRUNEI MUSEUM

Brunei's national museum spotlights Brunei's role in Southeast Asia's history. The Islamic Art Gallery has historical pieces of Islamic art and a commendable Quran collection.

BRUNEI ARTS AND HANDICRAFTS CENTRE

Brunei's ancient and traditional arts and crafts – *kain tenunan*, silver & brass ware, wood carving and basketry – are showcased in this centre, aimed to preserve its rich legacy.

TAMU KIANGGEH

The Tamu, or open air market, on the banks of the Kianggeh River is a popular local market for traditional dishes, fruits, vegetables, flowers and handicrafts.

KAMPONG AYER

The world's largest water village that is home to more than 30,000 people living on unique wooden houses on stilts over the Brunei River.

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








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
